### From the Desk of the Pastor ...

reetings to everyone,

I spent an hour this week listening to Leonard Cohen sing his own songs. It was a different experience because we usually hear other people singing his songs - like Judy Collins.

His voice is low and a bit gravely, but clear. His words are deep. (Listen to his most popular song - "Alleluia" - a broken alleluia. He does not fall into any musical category. In his collective style there is jazz, rock, folk and even classical. In his verses, his faith comes through, not as a surface praise song, but as a studied man of scripture.

This is where he catches me: Faith is how we live. Faith is found in our relationships - even negative ones. Even in very intimate ones. Cohen refuses to "box" his religion. For me, that's how it should be. Our faith needs to be part of everyday life - not just Sunday morning.

Cohen pushes this to the limit. In doing so, he ends up where he began: Love. Love is the nature of God. Love is the core in our relationships. Without love all falls apart into despair and hopelessness.

You can find Cohen on youTube and CD's. Listen, if you will, how he integrates faith into everyday situations. In his song "There ain't no cure for love" he tells us how and why.

- The hip-breakers return September 22nd


#### June 2018 Budget Update (Combined General and Building Funds)

Shown below is a chart which shows a simplified over view of our budget numbers for the first six months of 2018.

The numbers through the end of June showed a combined shortfall in the General and Building Funds of \$2,064 between budgeted expenses and actual offerings. In the month of June we did not need to take anything from our building savings account to meet expenses.

#### **Back Bay Mission Trip 2018 Update for August**

We are now less than 45 days from our trip to Back Bay Mission and we are currently locked in for 15 people (ranging in age from 16 to 67).

We should still be able to add anyone that may be interested in making the trip, we'd just need to check with BBM. Anyone who is not a member of the congregation we would ask that those individual(s) cover the cost of the per person fee from Back Bay Mission, which is \$250.

We do have another sandwich sale coming up in August – orders will be due August 19<sup>th</sup>, and pickup will be on August 29<sup>th</sup>. **Please remember** that we will continue to collect personal travel size items (feminine hygiene pads, deodorant, shampoo, soap, Kleenex, toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs, hand lotion, bushes, wet wipes) and we are also asking for donations of sweatshirts and t-shirts. On our first trip we learned how much of a need there was for these items for the homeless, many of whom sleep on the beaches in and near Biloxi.

We have also received a "Wish List" from Back Bay Mission for items for each of the different ministries they have ongoing. The wish list is located in the newsletter as a separate page.

Our challenge to the congregation is still in place: for those who can to donate \$5 per person each week toward the mission trip to help cover our expenses.

More updates on our progress will follow throughout the August - if you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask any of the people who have signed up to go on the trip (the list is outside the choir room).



# HOME AT LAST

Rose Kennedy said, "Life isn't a matter of milestones, but memories." For one of our Home at Last (HAL) clients that is entirely true. This client entered our Home at Last Permanent Supportive Housing in February 2017. At the time of his intake into the program his story really embodied the Housing First theory that there should be no barriers to being housed. Housing takes place first then they are wrapped in the services that they need to become self-sufficient. This particular client was a long-term alcoholic that was close to death on the streets. Luckily, he was housed with the Home at Last program. From there we got him into to detox, after detox he attended Crossroads Recovery Center for further treatment. After he successfully finished Crossroads he came back to his fully furnished/stocked apartment. He started working with an aftercare specialist on a weekly basis to work through his recovery.

When I first encountered this gentleman, about 6 months ago, he was adamant that he did not want to talk about his sobriety or share his story with other people. Through his work with his aftercare therapist he approached me and asked if I would allow him to come along to do outreach with me. He felt he could pay it forward and maybe reach other people with the struggles he went through. After some conversations between him, myself, and his therapist we decided that it could be an amazing experience as long as it did not affect his sobriety. We started the process by taking him to an Open Doors Homeless Coalition monthly meeting, where he not

only attended but stood in front of a room full of people and told his story of perseverance and the will to help others; he received a standing ovation. His enthusiasm for this outreach was really intoxicating. We set a day to head out to camps planning to meet up the following week to start our journey together.

The day we mutually decided to go out, I let Him pick the camp he wanted to go to. He asked if we could go to his old camp to see if anyone might be living there again. He lived at this particular camp for two and a half years until he was arrested, and the cops removed him from the property. We walked for a long time as I was following him to his camp. When we arrived, it was a full circle moment, his camp was still mostly intact. His things were still there scattered on the ground forgotten about by everyone but him. It was an emotional journey for everyone who was there that day; we got to witness and see the success that he envisioned for himself.

His story is a powerful story of success! Success that can come from believing in yourself; and when you have a team of people like Back Bay Mission, an after-care specialist, Mental Health Association, and people who will love and support you on the journey to recovery. His road will continue, and milestones will occur, but his memories looking back can be a useful and a powerful tools that he can take into the field with me to pay it forward and maybe touch other people's lives as he undoubtedly touched ours




#### Donations Needed for the Early Learning
