Hello St. Jacobs Family,






September 2018 Budget Update (Combined General and Building Funds)

Shown below is a chart which shows a simplified over view of our budget numbers for the nine months of 2018. The numbers through the end of June showed a combined shortfall in the General and Building Funds of \$14,411 between budgeted expenses and actual offerings. In the month of September we did not need to take anything from our building savings account to meet expenses.

Budget update:

With many of our members and friends now returning from summer/early fall time away, please be mindful that our operating costs and expenses have been ongoing. Our latest figures through September show that month to have been a particularly challenging one. Our general and building accounts began the month with an offering and receipt budget deficit of (\$9,544), we had (\$4,867) fewer dollar offered than hoped for during the five September Sundays, and we ended the month with a deficit of (\$14,411). This deficit exceeds last year's position, when with thirteen (13) Sundays remaining our deficit was (\$8,155). Please prayerfully consider how you may help lessen our current year shortfall. Thank you!

Fellow Member of St. Jacob's UCC:

Our Search Committee has been screening profiles since 2017, hoping to find a candidate who meets our specific criteria for a 'settled' pastor. During this period of time, there were only two (2) whom the committee possibly considered submitting to the congregation; however, their paths took them into different directions.

In order to provide us with stability as the search continues, Pastor Richard R. Stuempfle has submitted a Call as a Designated-Term Pastor for a period of two (2) years. This means he is willing to serve as our part-time pastor beginning January 1, 2019. After two years, his Call as a Designated-Term Pastor may or may not be extended. At that time, another option could be for Pastor Rick to be considered for our 'settled' pastor, if that were his desire, as well as our congregation's.

The Search Committee will continue their work during this period, seeking a 'settled' pastor for St. Jacob's UCC. If during this two-year period a suitable candidate is found as our 'settled' pastor, Pastor Rick would retire.

On Sunday, November 11, 2018, a vote to accept <u>OR</u> to not accept Pastor Rick's Call as a Designated-Term Pastor will be held, immediately following our worship service.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2018

On that date, a quorum of 50 of the membership of St. Jacob's UCC needs to be present to proceed with a vote. Voting will be done by secret ballot. There will be a time for questions, comments, etc.
